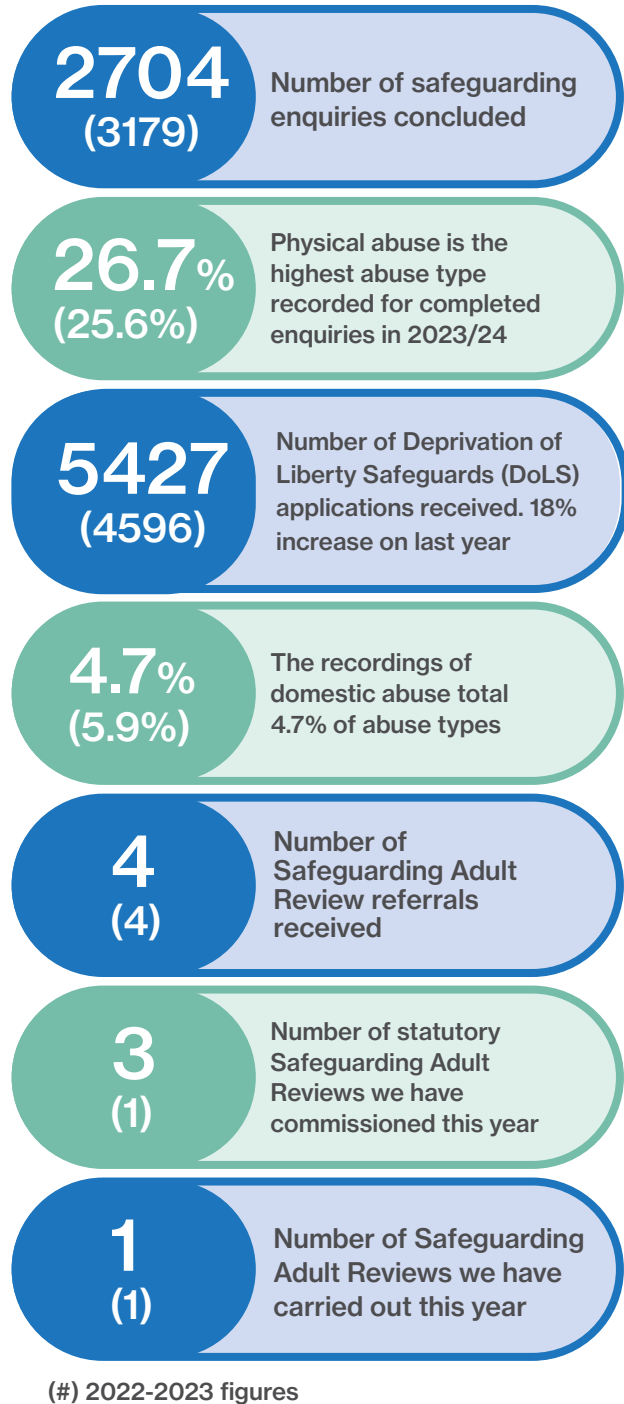
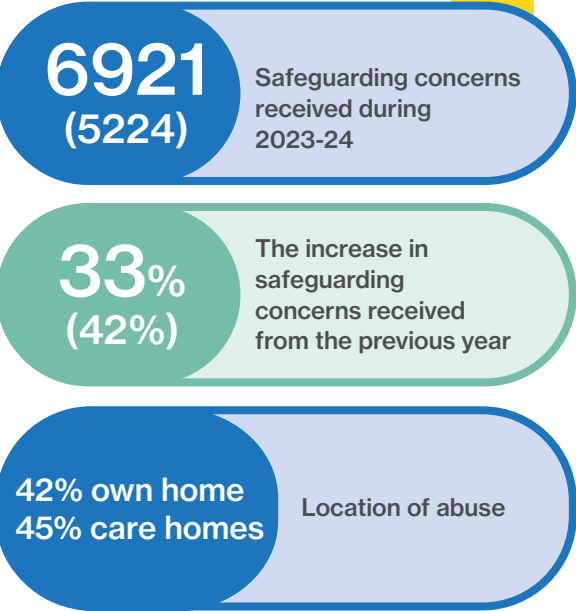
- Trading Standards and Scam Awareness
