Safeguarding Week 2024

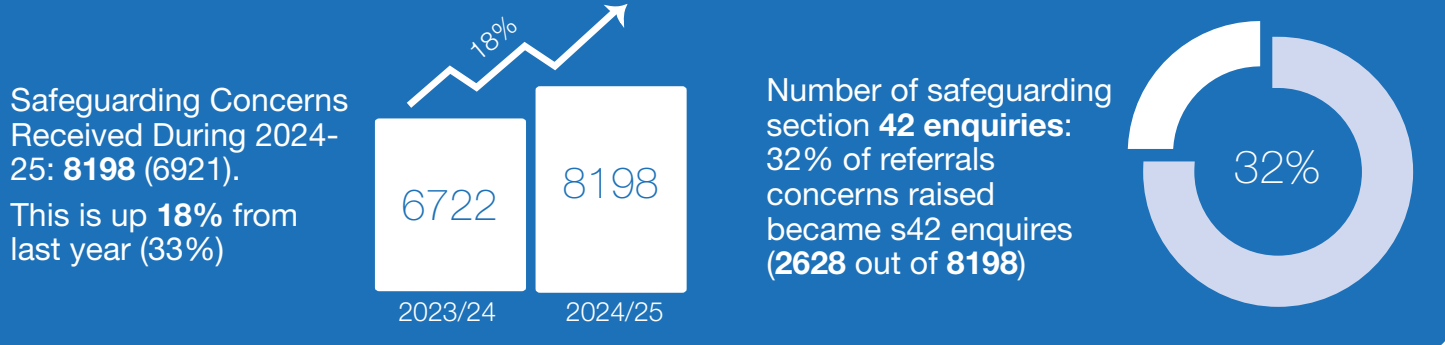


In 2024 we delivered an extensive programme of over 44 sessions with over 3700 attendees. Key topics from the NYSAB were:

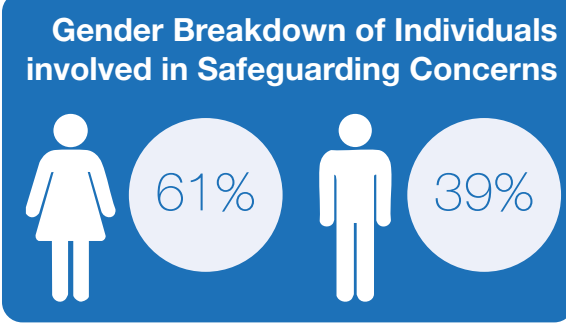
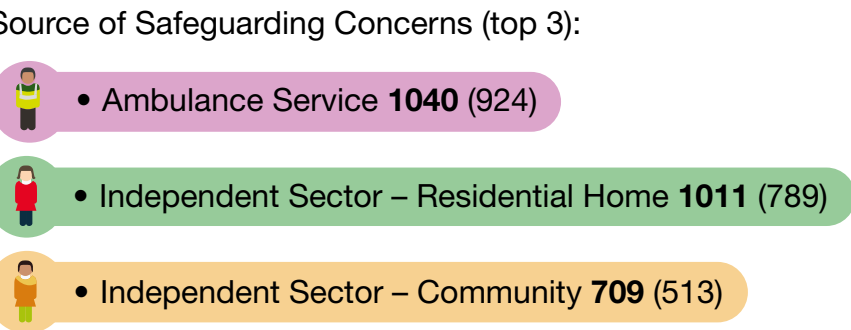
- How to report concerns

Breakdown of Section 42 Enquiries by Location of Abuse:

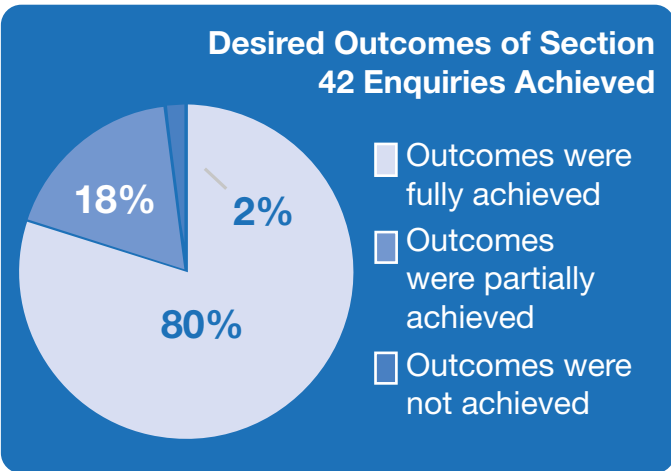
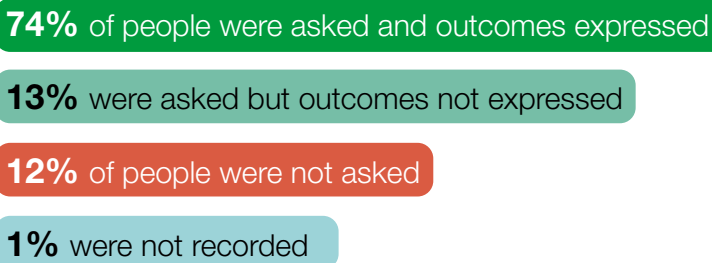
The largest percentage of enquiries shows that most of the abuse is within care homes at **44%** with **42%** in people's own homes, **4%** hospital and **10%** in the community/other.

Types of abuse:

Physical abuse remains the top type of abuse at **30%**, up from **26%** last year. Neglect is 2nd at **28%**. There was a slight reduction in financial abuse at **7.1%** down from **10.0%** last year.
